7:15 Principal Kay's Corner

- Things are going well with kids back at Columbus, kids are getting used to the rules of masks, moving around the hallways, assigned seats in the cafeteria, etc. Important for families to remember that they have to wear masks in the playground, at drop-off, etc.
- No school Veteran's Day November 11
- Early dismissal Wednesday, November 25
- No school November 26-27
- Check the Medford website about quarantine restrictions post-travel if leaving the state/area for the Thanksgiving holiday.
- Library interviews taking place; main responsibility will be helping with Chromebook needs and distribution to families (chargers don't work, screens break, etc.)
- Teachers are getting MacBooks will hopefully see an improvement in the technology for the teachers.
- Hybrid acknowledges concerns that kids' backpacks are heavy (because kids are transporting Chromebooks back and forth to school). They need the Chromebooks because some assessments are online, music is remote (per DESE guidelines), etc.
- Specials Dr Edouard Vincent had stated that families who opt for remote model might not have Columbus teachers, but very much wanted kids to have their homeroom teachers be a Columbus teacher. Once the hybrid model was introduced, in many cases, it wasn't possible for the same teachers to cover remote AND hybrid. District is hiring a remote

computer teacher. The specials teachers the kids had this week should be who they have going forward.

• COVID - if there is a positive case within the school can't identify the child or classroom because of privacy and HIPAA laws. Letter will be sent home to inform the community. If there was close contact, you will be informed. Recommendation is that you have your child tested, would then need to quarantine for a specific amount of time. Teachers (all employees, including paras, etc.) have access to regular testing (required before they

come back and strongly encouraged to do it regularly); contact tracing;

involvement by the Board of Health.

• Whiteboards - purchased/distributed to the kids, will need to be returned

at the end of the year.

• Water bottle filling stations - purchased 2, waiting for them to be installed

(on the 1st and 3rd floors).

• School name change - process not likely to start until after the break.

Committee of the Whole (School Committee); would like to involve the

conversations.
